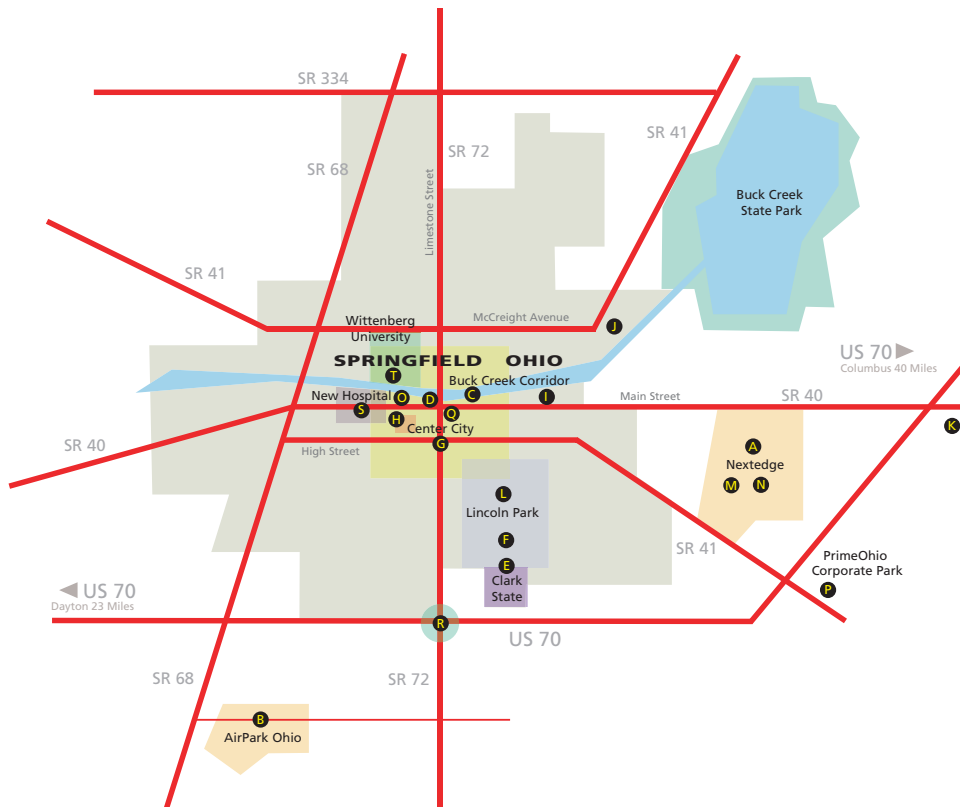


## MORE THAN ONE HALF BILLION DOLLARS PROJECTED FOR COMMUNITY PROJECTS



### A. AVETEC \$9.9M

New headquarters for local company with world-class computer modeling and simulation environment and conference and meeting space in Nextedge Applied Research and Technology Park

### B. BOB EVANS FARMS \$9M

More than doubled its warehouse space in 2007 with plans for further expansion

### C. BUCK CREEK CORRIDOR \$2.5M

A vision to create an adventure sports attraction for kayakers, canoeists, rock climbers, bikers and others

### D. CENTER CITY PARK \$2M

Green space connecting downtown to Wittenberg University, located immediately west of the National City Bank building would serve as gathering place

### E. CLARK STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE \$836,990

Basic campus renovations and expansion of the Clark State Community College Performing Arts Center

### F. CLIFTON COURT \$2,550,000

Subdivision with 17 homes at a cost of \$2,550,000 in Phase I and 20 in Phase II is a joint project of the Neighborhood Housing Partnership of Greater Springfield and the Building Industry Association of Clark County

### G. DOWNTOWN MASTERPLAN (NA)

Designated districts as part of the plan are the Buck Creek District, Core District, Arts, Culture and Heritage District, Center City East, Civic District, and Redevelopment District

### H. FAMILY ICE ARENA \$5M

Site selection and acquisition efforts are ongoing for the third major construction project that is part of a \$17 million improvement and expansion of local parks and recreation projects

### I. HOLLANDIA BOTANICAL GARDENS \$7.1 M

An 11-acre parcel of land along Buck Creek that extends from the intersection of Warder and Water Streets to Sherman Avenue is currently being developed

### J. LAGONDA REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT \$6M

The 70 acre brownfield site at the former location of the International Harvester plant on Lagonda Avenue will be suitable for light to heavy industry usage

### K. INTERSTATE 70 \$28M

Four-mile widening project between Route 40 and Route 54 at South Vienna to begin late 2008

### L. LINCOLN PARK HOUSING \$20M

The mixed residential and apartment complex is part of the \$20 million Hope VI project on the south end of town that replaced a deteriorated housing project. Many of the homes are complete and ready for occupancy

### M. MILLS MORGAN DEVELOPMENT \$8.1M

First of three proposed 55,000-plus square-foot buildings completed in 2008 at Nextedge Applied Research and Technology Park

### N. NEXTEDGE APPLIED RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY PARK \$30M

Located on 244 acres east of downtown on Route 40, the park has proven successful with a number of technology companies committed to the park

### O. OHIO VALLEY MEDICAL CENTER \$15M

The 46,000-square-foot facility is expected to be completed by early 2009 at 100 W. Main St. with a \$50 to \$60 million expansion possible

### P. PRIMEOHIO CORPORATE PARK II \$7M

A 2008 goal of the Greater Springfield Chamber of Commerce is finding a suitable site for a second industrial park

### Q. SHAWNEE HOTEL APARTMENTS \$14.1M

Exterior updating, work on elevators and handicap accessibility are included in the project for the 85-unit apartment building downtown

### R. SOUTH LIMESTONE STREET GATEWAY \$50,000-\$75,000

A new gateway wrought iron decorative fence with landscaping will greet visitors and residents as they enter the city from the south

### S. SPRINGFIELD REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER \$250M

Completion is set for 2012, replacing what was Mercy Medical Center and Community Hospital

### T. WITTENBERG PLAN (NA)

The strategic plan titled Distinctively Wittenberg: A Vision For Excellence adopted in 2006 lists as its goal renewing and sustaining the historic heart of campus

## ACCOMPLISHMENTS

**SplashZone Water Park** opened in 2007 as part of the National Trail Parks and Recreation District \$17 million project. The Carleton Davidson baseball stadium, also part of the project, opened in 2004.

**The Pennsylvania House \$1M** renovation was completed and reopened to visitors in 2007. The Inn, built to accommodate travelers on the National Road, was built in 1839.

**The Champions Center**, which opened in 2004, is a state-of-the-art livestock arena that hosts regional, national and international events, primarily horse shows, year round. The facility also includes a banquet and exhibit hall at the Clark County Fairgrounds.

**Frank Lloyd Wright's Westcott House \$5.3M** renovation was completed and opened to the public for tours and special events.

**AirPark Ohio** - Bob Evans Farms more than doubled its warehouse space in 2007. Spectra Jet opened its new hanger as the first of a six phase expansion plan. MEVA Formwork Systems began building a new facility. TPI Composites occupied an existing building and began shipping product in 2007.

**Springfield City Schools** completed a \$166 million construction project, replacing all school buildings and consolidating North and South into one new high school in 2008.
