Brief History:

City-Wide and County –Wide “Hot Spot” Information is something Law Enforcement should know. Law Enforcement learns about “Hot Spots” when citizens report them. Clark County Triad will send “Hot Spot cards to City and County Law Enforcement for immediate investigation or you can complete this on-line “Information Report.” Any information that you provide is vital for all law enforcement in order to develop leads to any criminal or drug investigation.

Law Enforcement meets with the Catholic Social Action Committee to review actions taken by law enforcement about the crime information that has been sent in.

Triad is a program of the International Association of Police Chiefs, National Sheriff’s Association that teams local law enforcement and senior organizations to work with seniors toward reducing criminal victimization and unwarranted fear of crime affecting older adults.
