## WHAT IS LAW CAMP?

The purpose of the Springfield Police Division Law Camp is to afford the youth of our community the opportunity to take an up close look at local law enforcement, military, and fire services, in an action packed three days.

This experience will provide students with a unique opportunity to gain insight into these vocations. Law Camp provides the opportunity to participate in practical, hands-on experiences. The students will develop new personal skills and participate in activities with other students and law enforcement officers. Law Camp will help students improve self-esteem, self-confidence, self-respect, and most of all, RESPECT FOR THE LAW.

Law Camp will allow students to gain an understanding of the importance of service to others, cooperative relationships between youths and adults, and a sense of acceptance. Students will then have a sense of belonging to a very unique group of young men and women who are committed to the welfare of our community.

The Springfield Police Division, Springfield Fire Division, and the Ohio State Patrol will present workshops. This will not be a classroom setting. We will present these workshops in a hands-on and fun

atmosphere.

The Civil Air Patrol (USAF Auxiliary) will lead the students through the camp. This will give students the opportunity to see other students that have already made the decision to serve others.

## Where

*Held at Hayward Middle School, 1700 Clifton Ave., this three-day camp is full of excitement for students who are 11 to 14 years of age by August 1st. The staff and instructors are local law enforcement, fire, and military personnel.*

## BASIC REQUIREMENTS

The Springfield Police Division is looking for young men and women, between the ages of 11 and 14. Students should want to learn more about the Police Division and what it really means to be in Public Service.

Local civic groups will provide lunch. Students should wear comfortable clothing. You should also possess a desire to learn about these areas of dedicated service in a fun and relaxed atmosphere.

- Applicants must be 11 to 14 years of age by July 30th
- Must not have been adjudicated of any criminal offense.
- Must not be a member of any gang or

organization that has goals contrary to the Springfield Police Division or any of the other agencies listed above.

- Must be of good moral character.
- Should be in good physical health.
- Student and Parent or Guardian must sign an agreement waiver.
- Students will be dismissed for discipline issues

## APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications can be picked up at the Information Window at Police Headquarters located at 130 N. Fountain Ave. or at the police substation 17 W. Johnny Lytle Ave.

Completed applications must be completed and returned to Police Headquarters by August 1, 2011. Students who are accepted into the Law Camp will be notified no later than August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2010. We only have room for 60 students.

## SELECTION PROCESS

The Chief of Police, or his designee, through an application process, will select a maximum of 60 students for Law Camp. Drop off is at **9:00 a.m.** and pick up at **3:00 p.m.**
